ORDINANCE NO. 43

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING TO JENS G. ODEGARD, HIS HEIRS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS, THE RIGHT TO USE AND OCCUPY THE STREETS, ALLEYS, AND OTHER PUBLIC PLACES OF THE CITY OF WASHBURN, NORTH DAKOTA, FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING, MAINTAINING AND OPERATING A GENERAL TELEPHONE SYSTEM WITHIN SAID CITY.

Be it Ordained by the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Washburn, North Dakota:

Section 1. That Jens G. Odegard, his heirs successors and assigns, is hereby granted the right to use and occupy the streets, alleys and other public places of the City of Washburn, North Dakota, for a term of twenty-five (25) years from the effective date hereof, for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating a general telephone system within said city.

Section 2. That the rights herein granted are subject too the exercise of the police power as the same now is or may hereafter be conferred upon said city.

Section 3. That Jens G. Odegard shall upon demand, pay the cost of publishing this ordinance.

Section 4. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect, and shall constitute a binding contract between the City of Washburn, North Dakota, and Jens G. Odegard, when it shall have been enacted and published according to law, and when the provisions hereof shall have been accepted in writing by said Jens G. Odegard.
