Hapip motioned to approve the budget public hearing minutes. Lelm seconded. Upon roll call, all members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Lelm motioned to approve September financials. Hapip seconded. Upon roll call, all members present voted age. Motion carried.

Lelm motioned to approve the bills. Hapip seconded. Upon roll call, all members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Lelm motioned to approve the appointment of Darren Lester to the planning and zoning committee board. Weber seconded. Upon roll call, all members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Jeremy with Ottertail Power was present to discuss the new franchise agreement between Ottertail and the City of Washburn. It is essentially the same as the previous one with maybe a little bit of different verbiage in there. Concerns were addressed about old poles in town and cutting of trees around the electrical lines. Lelm motioned to approve the Ottertail Franchise Agreement. Hapip seconded. Upon roll call, all members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Lelm motioned to accept the quote from SP&E to adjust the pulleys for the basketball hoop at the Memorial Building. Hapip seconded. Upon roll call, all members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Brandt presented a spreadsheet for applicants for the special assessment assistance program. Hapip motioned to approve both applicants. Lelm seconded. Upon roll call, all members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Brandt presented a mowing bill to be special assessed to a property that is unpaid. Hapip motioned to approve the unpaid mowing bill to be special assessed to. Weber seconded. Upon roll call, all members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Brandt presented a quote to purchase a new 12" actuator this year and two more after the start of 2026 for \$7,472.47 each. Lelm motioned to approve the purchase. Hapip seconded. Upon roll call, all members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Brandt read a change to the Ordinance 117A-2 to include the verbiage change of daily penalties of \$150 per day may be assessed if compliance is not accomplished within the specified time frame. Lelm motioned to approve the change. Hapip seconded. Upon roll call, all members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Brandt read a couple policy changes to the employee policy manual. Hapip motioned to approve the changes. Lelm seconded. Upon roll call, all members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Hapip motioned to start using the consent agenda philosophy for meetings with the office staff determining what gets placed on the consent agenda prior to the meeting. Lelm seconded. Upon roll call, all members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Lelm would like to switch commission portfolios to water/sewer and taken off buildings and grounds. Discussion on changing now when a special election is a couple of months away and changes will need to be made then. Lelm motioned to switch over to water/sewer portfolio. Hapip seconded. Discussion had on keeping buildings and grounds for now as well. Weber-aye, Hapip-nay, Lelm – aye. Hapip motioned to add buildings and grounds to Lelm and police/fire to himself. Hapip rescinded his motion to add Mark to buildings/grounds, Hapip to library, and Weber to police/fire. Lelm seconded. Upon roll call, all members present voted aye. Motion carried.
